Campus Pride - \$2,500

Service Learning Alternative Break College Program

To actively engage Charlotte area colleges in alternative service learning within the Charlotte community, meet LGBTQ and ally leaders from Charlotte, understand queer history and activism in the South and leave behind a service learning project to improve the organization/local community.

Clayworks - \$3,000

Ceramic Workshops for Time Out Youth

To engage LGBT youth in the creative arts and help find new ways to express themselves, with a secondary focus on building teamwork and communication skills.

NC AIDS Action Network - \$2,000 LGBTQ Rights and HIV: Queen City Conversations

To increase the capacity of the LGTBQ community in Charlotte to build cultural competency around LGBTQ health and to empower them to take action to improve the wellbeing of the community.

RAIN - \$3,500

Insurance Premium Assistance Program – LGBTQ People Living with HIV

To help LGBTQ individuals living with HIV in obtaining and keeping health insurance that addresses their unique medical needs by assisting with annual health insurance premiums and deductibles, physician visits and prescription copayments.

Safe Alliance - \$4,000 Effectively Engaging LGBTQ Clients

To develop an outreach campaign to the LGBTQ community about domestic violence and sexual assault.

Stonewall Sports - \$3,000 Rainbow Run

To host an LGBT and Ally 5k road race that provides: a) a run open to all members of our community which will bring people of different backgrounds together; b) financial support through fundraising to three local charities which will consist of a LGBT, animal and veterans charity and c) volunteer giveback component to the neighborhood chosen for the run.

Time Out Youth - \$4,800 LBGTQ Youth Podcast

To establish a presence in an accessible new medium that would allow LGBTQ youth in Charlotte to provide support, advocacy and connections with other LGBTQ youth. Time Out Youth Center will develop and implement a monthly podcast facilitated by LGBTQ youth and Center staff to provide intended audience with support and education on LGBTQ topics
