Foundation For Black Philanthropy Grants \$20,000 for Education, Health Care and More

CHARLOTTE MECKLENBURG – Foundation For Black Philanthropy recently awarded \$20,000 in grants to local nonprofits. The grants will support programs that address a wide range of community needs across Charlotte and Mecklenburg County.

Foundation For Black Philanthropy is an affiliate of the Charlotte-based Foundation For The Carolinas. The grants were awarded by the FFBP's local board of advisors as part of an annual grantmaking program, which has invested more than \$500,000 in Charlotte/Mecklenburg residents since 1993.

The following grant awards support a range of activities benefitting Charlotte's African American community:

- **\$5,000 to Another Chance House of Refuge Inc.** to support the Transitional Housing Program, which provides shelter for individuals who are involved in the justice system or experiencing housing insecurity.
- **\$5,000 to The Male's Place** to assist with their Ujima Greenhouse Project which offers direct access to fresh vegetables, fruits, and herbs to seniors and underserved neighbors along the Beatties Ford Road corridor.
- **\$5,000 to Stiletto Boss University** for their summer camp program that teaches entrepreneurship, social/emotional learning, and community impact.
- **\$5,000 to S.T.A.R.S. Math and English Academy** to fund academic enrichment for students during End-of-Grade (EOG) Bootcamp, Saturday Academy, and summer programming.
